How McCain Voted	Bill Number	Summary of the Bill
YES	HR 3045	To implement the Dominican Republic-Central America-United States Free Trade Agreement.
NO	HR 800	To amend the National Labor Relations Act to establish an efficient system to enable employees to form, join, or assist labor organizations, to provide for mandatory injunctions for unfair labor practices during organizing efforts, and for other purposes. Vote on a motion to invoke on a bill that amends the National Labor Relations Act to eliminate a requirement for a vote to organize a labor union, outline a time frame for the bargaining process, and provide certain penalties for employers who attempt to influence the formation of a union.
YES	HR 3045	To implement the Dominican Republic-Central America-United States Free Trade Agreement.
YES	HR 2738	To implement the United States-Chile Free Trade Agreement.
YES	HR 3009	To extend the Andean Trade Preference Act, to grant additional trade benefits under that Act, and for other purposes.
YES	HR 4444	To authorize extension of nondiscriminatory treatment (normal trade relations treatment) to the People's Republic of China, and to establish a framework for relations between the United States and the People's Republic of China.
YES	HR 434	An act to authorize a new trade and investment policy for sub-Saharan Africa, expand trade benefits to the countries in the Caribbean Basin, renew the generalized system of preferences, and reauthorize the trade adjustment assistance programs.
NO	S AMDT 890 to S 955	To state the sense of the Senate that Most Favored Nations trade status for China should be revoked.
YES	S Amdt 4438 to S 295:	An amendment that revises the National Labor Relations Act of 1935 to allow employers to form labor-management cooperative organizations with employees without the presence of a union .
YES	HR 743	Vote to amend the National Labor Relations Act of 1935 to allow employers to form labor-management cooperative organizations with employees without the presence of a union.
